New rules for visas

The “Dirección General de Migración y Extranjería (DGME)” has published an addendum to the decree called “Directrices Generales de Visas de Ingreso y Permanencia para No Residentes” applicable to foreign people in the non-residents category. Hereafter, a summary of the most relevant changes:

From the last visas decree, there are still the same exceptions to enter for people from countries that need a consular visa or a consulted visa, but now in the section of American and Canadian visa, it is also accepted the American visa types D y C1/D as exception.

Changes applicable to people from specific countries

Colombia: Passport expiration date may be at least three months prior the entry and the legal stay may be up to 90 days, applicable for tourists.

There have been included two new categories: multiple visas for Colombian businessman, that can be valid for five years and tourist multiple visas for Colombian people, that can be valid for one year. In both cases you can send paperwork online.

Haiti: Haiti is added to the list of countries that its citizens may need a transit visa at the country. Now the countries included on the list are: Nicaragua, Cuba, Venezuela and Haiti.

Venezuela: For the arrival or departure of Venezuelan citizens, it will be accepted passports with expiration date of at least one day.
